

Dr. Lorrie Kirshenbaum is the Director of the Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences, Albrechtsen Research Centre, St. Boniface Hospital. He is principal investigator of Cardiac Gene Biology, Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences, Albrechtsen Research Centre, St. Boniface Hospital, and Professor, Department of Physiology and Pathophysiology, University of Manitoba. He holds a Canada Research Chair in Molecular Cardiology.

Dr. Kirshenbaum is also currently the Director of Research Development Max Rady College of Medicine, University of Manitoba. His research is setting the stage for the use of gene therapy in the treatment of cardiovascular diseases and is supported by a Foundation grant from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and the St. Boniface Hospital Foundation. Dr. Kirshenbaum is a Fellow of the International Academy of Cardiovascular Sciences, International Society of Cardiovascular Research, American Heart Association and Canadian Academy of Health Sciences.

Dr. Kirshenbaum is internationally recognized for his pioneering work and has published over 300+ research articles in prestigious high-profile journals, such as Nature Medicine, Nature Cancer, Journal of Clinical Investigation, as well as several text book chapters, books and has received several prestigious honors and awards for his research and leadership achievements. Dr. Kirshenbaum serves on many journal editorial boards and international committees, as well as national and international peer review grant panels including Canadian Institutes of Health Research, Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, American Heart Association and has served as the chair of the National Institute of Health and Centre for Scientific Advancement Study Section in the United States.
